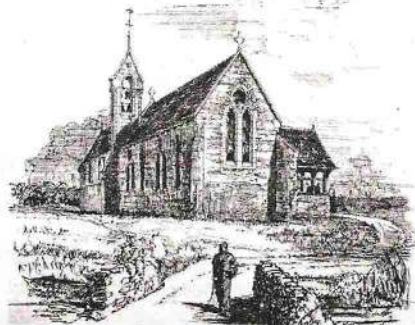
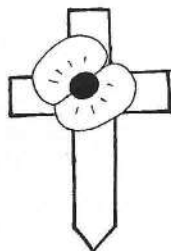

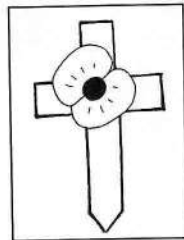
Reader: Especially we remember today those from this parish who gave their lives in the service of their country in two World Wars.

THE BIDDING

As we think of how unworthy we often are of those who made the supreme sacrifice let us confess our sins to Almighty God.

**We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ who died for us, forgive us all that is
past;
And grant that we may serve you in newness of life
To the glory of your name. Amen.**
